If this is your first visit with a service officer, Ashfield you will want to bring documentation with you to support your claim. Bernardston Buckland You will need the following items to file your claim: Original or certified copy of your discharge papers (DD-214 or other) Charlemont \*Note: If you don't have a copy of your DD-214, contact us to complete a form SF-180. Colrain Medical evidence of your diagnosis including statement(s) from doctor(s) showing Conway current medical condition being claimed that list date of diagnosis and doctor's name and contact information (address, phone, fax) if not a VA doctor Deerfield Medical evidence indicating that the disability was caused by or arose during your Π Erving active duty service Gill Medical treatment records Collateral statement(s) – eyewitness accounts Greenfield Other evidence you believe will support your claim Hawley Heath You may also need the following items, if they apply to your situation: Copy of marriage certificate Leverett Copy(s) of birth certificate(s) for each claimed dependent, including your spouse Leyden Copy of death certificate, if applying for survivor's benefits Monroe Copy(s) of divorce decree(s) for veteran and spouse Copy of guardianship document/court letters Montague Copy of Social Security award letters showing current benefit rate New Salem Copy of pension or annuity award letter showing current benefit rate Northfield Any correspondence from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs Social Security numbers for each claimed dependent Plainfield Bank account and routing numbers (required for direct deposit of VA payments) Rowe Shelburne NOTE: All documents (especially DD-214) should be either originals or certified copies. A claim may be filed without all of the required documents; however, all of the above Shutesbury information relevant to the claim will be needed before a decision can be made on your Sunderland claim. Claims received without full information may take longer to process or be denied until Warwick the information is received. Claims based on a non-service-connected disability or death generally require active duty during a recognized wartime period.
